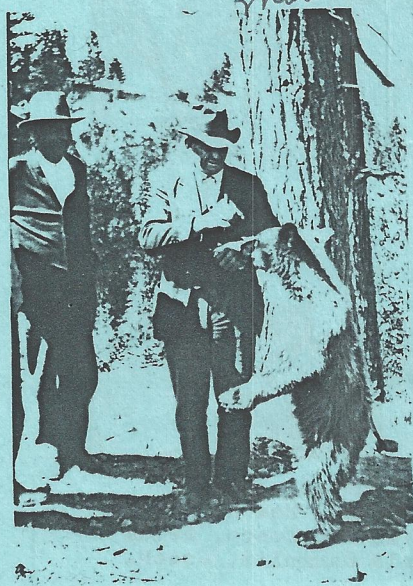

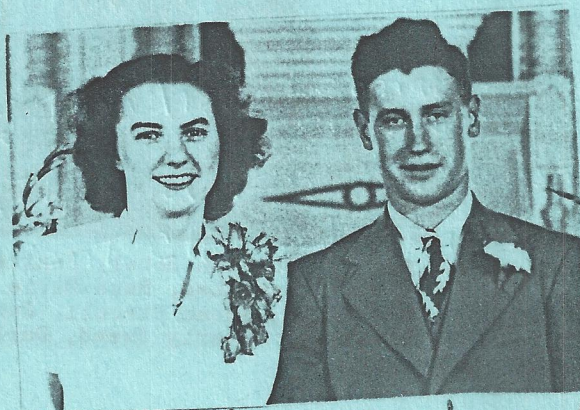

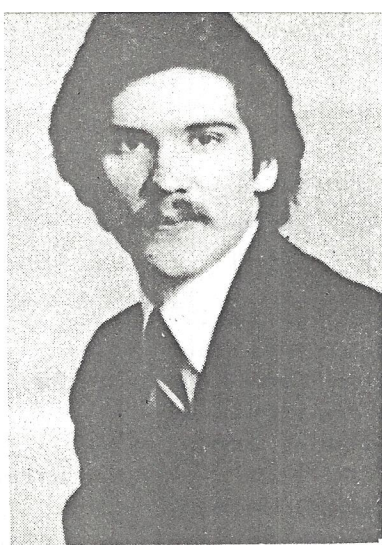

Tom is the son of Fred and Janice Hare of Fertile. He participated in track and football in high school and is undecided about his future plans.

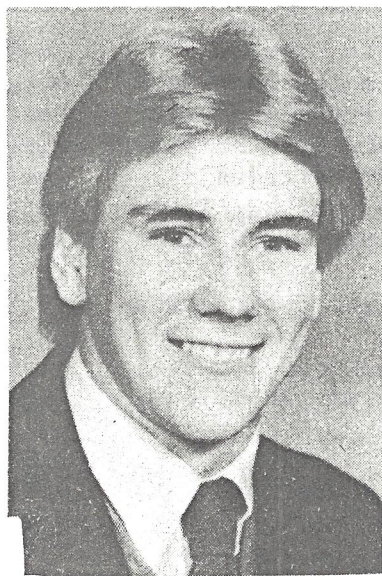

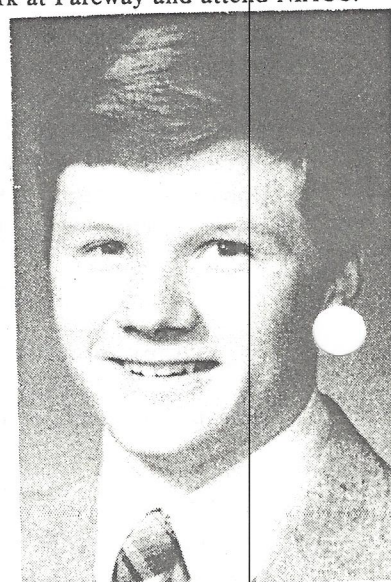

Melchor is the son of Jesus and Blanca Ochoa of Fertile. He plans to work somewhere after graduation.



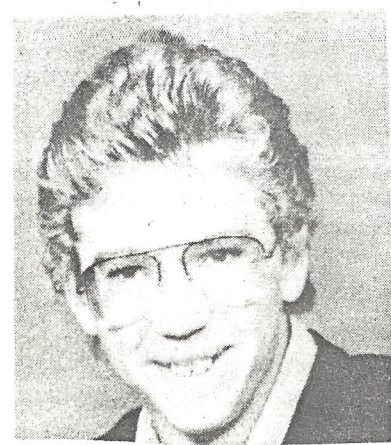

Jeff is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Dale Hyde of Fertile. He participated in FFA while in school and plans to farm following graduation.



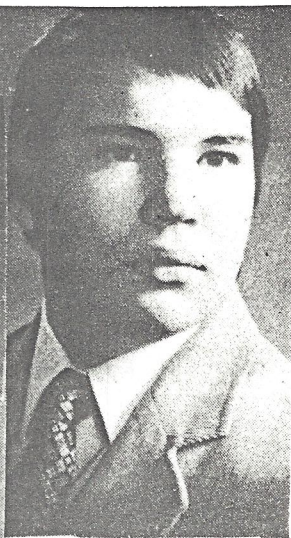
