







FERTILE REMINDER



PHIL SHEIMO

Born November 13, 1899, at the Sheimo homestead 1 mile west of Fertile. Phil is the youngest of eleven children. He is the son of Kittle O. and Marie (Ouverson) Sheimo.

In 1921, he graduated from the Iowa School of Auctioneering in Logan, Iowa. He auctioneered through retirement, and still enjoys attending sales.

In the late 20's, Phil introduced Coca Cola as a new product in 8 counties in and around Marshall, in Southwestern Minnesota.

The Oliver Farm Implement in Fort Dodge was operated by Sheimo brothers Phil and Andrew for several years before Phil returned to Fertile, where he has farmed and raised livestock for nearly 40 years.

Always active and interested in Community affairs, he spent one term as Mayor, was voted Best Dressed Man in the Fertile Centennial in 1956, and was still able to wear the same Centennial outfit 25 years later at the Guasicentennial in 1981.

As a long time resident of Putsy, Phil appeared in front of the Old Mill in the 1974 Forester Camper brochure, and is Fertile's oldest resident.

Today, at age 90, Phil still enjoys good health, sporting events on T.V., home Canning, and does his own cooking and housework. His family, especially his greatgrandson, keep him entertained, as well as visits from his many friends.






This picture was taken in 1974 in front of the Fertile Mill. With him are Merle and Edna Hill.




