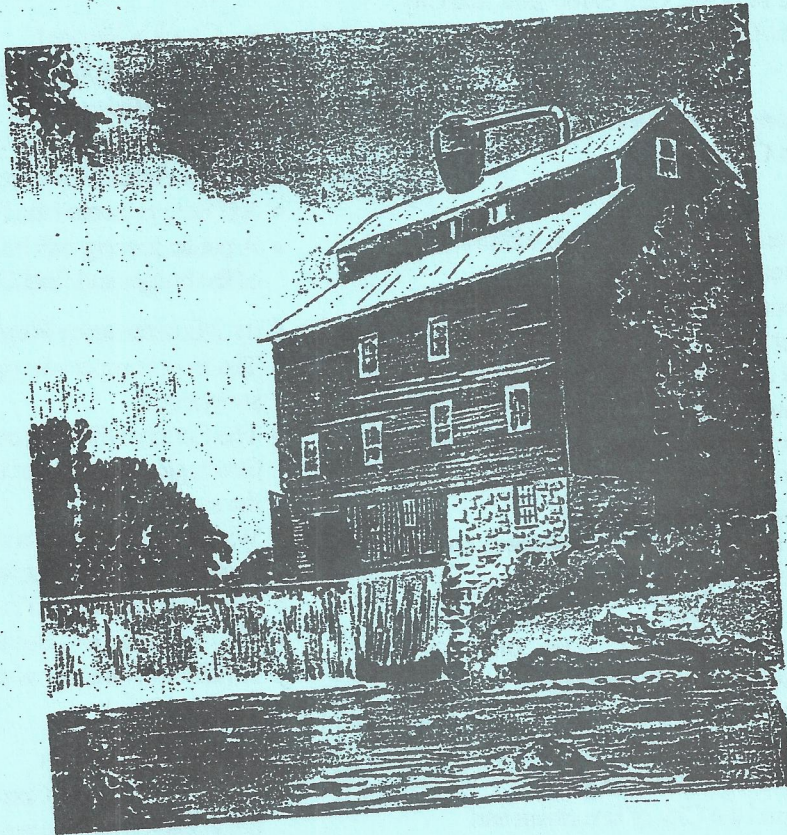

City Council Meeting Minutes

February 19, 2008, 7:00 PM, City Hall

1.) Call to Order

The Fertile City Council met at 7:00 PM in regular session, February 19, 2008, at Fertile City Hall.

2.) Roll Call

Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell, Council Members: Jeff Berg, Tad Miller, Cind Peters, Pat Renchin, Gail Shropshire, and City Clerk Eddie May. Absent was City Manager Warren Bruns.

3.) Minutes Approval

- *Renchin motioned and Shropshire 2nd to approve the January minutes.* Motion Carried.

4.) Tom Kirschbaum

- Tom Kirschbaum asked the Council to lower his estimated usage for his last three water and sewer bills.
- Mr. Kirschbaum refused entry to his home in November 2007 to install a new water meter. Since then, the City has been estimating his usage based on the average City utility bill.
- In January, Mr. Kirschbaum installed a two year old meter he had previously received from City Manager Bruns. When the meter was read at the end of January, it was determined that it was not working, so his bill was estimated again.
- Mr. Kirschbaum was also upset that the City had not dug up the storm sewer tiles to investigate any blockage backing up his spring water coming from his property.
- Last fall, the Council approved this action, but the contractor asked to perform the task was unable to meet Mr. Kirschbaum's requests before winter came.
- Mayor Russell told him that the City would get someone to investigate this issue as soon as possible this spring.
- Mr. Kirschbaum also accused the City of favoritism and inconsistency enforcing the City Ordinances. May asked for a list of issues so that they could be addressed. Mr. Kirschbaum presented a list of the City Businesses from the City's website. He pointed out the businesses which he believed were not paying sales tax on their sewage usage. (State law says that "sewage services, nonresidential commercial only" are taxable.) May said that he would investigate this issue.
- Mr. Kirschbaum stated that he will allow entry to his home for installation of a new water meter and reader.
- Mr. Kirschbaum stated he will be contacting his attorney.

5.) Approval of Fire Department Officers

- Fire Chief Jeff Berg presented the Council with this year's Officers for the Fertile Fire Department: Chief – Jeff Berg, Asst Chief – Josh Miller, Secretary – Mike Dain, Treasurer – Dan Miller, Training Safety Officers – Dan Lee, Dwight Bruns and John Jordan.
- *Shropshire motioned and Peters 2nd to approve the Officers as stated above.* Motion Carried.

6.) Mayor's Report

- WCTA removed the phone booth near Thompson's garage. They will use the parts for other booths; therefore, the booth was not available to the City.

- Emergency Management is working on a system to connect all County Emergency communications systems.
- The City submitted a WCDA grant for 2nd half of fire truck request. The awards ceremony is tentatively set for April 16th.
- In 2007 the City received a total of \$143,267.83 from the WCDA and the Casino for various projects.
- The KIOW tractor ride will come through Fertile at noon Friday, July 11th. They will stop at the Rhodes Island Park.
- The County Supervisors state that the town to market roads are budgeted to be re-surfaced in 2009.

7.) City Clerk's Report

- May presented January financials.
- *Renchin motioned and Miller 2nd to approve the January Expenditures.* Motion Carried.
- Budget discussions were finalized.
- Jeff Berg presented the Fire Department financials.
- A public hearing will be held on March 4th for public approval of the budget and final Council adoption.

8.) City Maintenance Report

- The front bumper was ripped off the Snow plow during this last snow storm.
- The County will wing out snow banks along Washington Street, please be certain that all property is moved away from the street.
- Warren was in Ames for a series of meetings regarding his licenses for water & sewer administration.
- The City has renewed their Lagoon license with the DNR.
- Mayor Russell and Bruns will meet with Water Tower Paint & Repair regarding our water tower maintenance contract February 25th.

9.) Committee Reports

- Community Center Committee – an informational survey is being mailed out this week, please respond by March 15th.
- Building permits – There are no size limitations within the City's building code pertaining to out-buildings. Size is only limited by the available land and property boundaries. Please see Tad Miller for more information.
- Fertile Days info is now on the website – more details coming soon!

10.) Upcoming Meetings

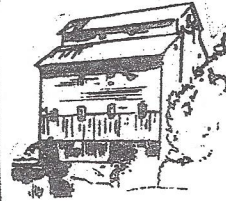
- A public hearing on the proposed budget will be held at the March 4, 2008 7:00 at City Hall.

LeNora Coretta Ouverson, of 404 First St. N. died February 16, 2008 at the Muse Norris Hospice Inpatient Unit, Mason City.



Funeral services were held Feb. 19, 2008 at Fertile Lutheran Church in Fertile with Lay Pastor David Halverson officiating. Interment was in the Brush Point Cemetery in rural Fertile.

LeNora was born on June 22, 1915 on the family farm in rural Joice, the daughter of Nels E. and Mary (Suby) Fjeld.

She graduated from Fertile High School in 1934 and then attended Iowa Teachers College in Cedar Falls where she obtained her teachers certification. She taught in rural school.

LeNora married Lawrence Ouverson on June 22, 1938 at the Beaver Creek Lutheran Church, rural Joice. They farmed in the rural Fertile area and she continued to live on the farm after her husband's death in 1950. In 1965, she moved to Forest City and later Clear Lake, and in 1973 to her present home.

She was very proud of her Norwegian heritage.

OUR FIRST FARM TRACTOR

Our father had always used horses for farm power, but in the early 1940's, he decided to switch to tractor power. Because of the war, there were no new ones available and of course, my father never bought anything new anyway. He shopped around and finally decided on a 1928 McCormick-Deering 1020.

It was an awkward machine with heavy steel wheels. It was not an all-purpose tractor since it had a wide front end that could not be used for cultivating corn. Farmers transferred their operation gradually, using the tractor for some jobs and horses for other operations. This tractor had a new red paint job on it, which probably influenced my father.

It was delivered in late evening with very little instruction on its operation. The next morning, all the neighbors gathered around to see my father's new pride and joy. He set the throttle, the choke and advanced the spark as instructed and turned the crank. Nothing happened so he cranked again.

This continued for over an hour with everyone trying his or her hand at it. Our fine new tractor did not start!

We did not have a phone at the time so my father drove on to Forest City to see about it. They told him there were two priming cups on top of the motor and you had to fill them with gas before starting. He tried and sure enough, it sprang into life, but what a life!

It had no brakes and on our hilly farm, we developed a system of one person sitting on the tractor riding the clutch, while another hooked up the plough. We had rocky fields and every time we hit a rock, the plough tripped and unhooked.

If there was any kind of wet spot, it would promptly get stuck and we would have to hitch our patient horses to it to pull it out. The steering was erratic at best and if we did not turn soon enough, we would tear into the fence. I had never heard my father swear before that time, but I heard words never before uttered.

One of our neighbors was very religious and we heard he would always pray at great length before starting his tractor work. I don't know whether it helped or not, but as they say, you needed any help you could get with the first tractor!

OLE: Vell, he vasn't exactly pleased about it.

CROCK POT WILD RICE SOUP

- 2 Tbsp. Butter
- 1 Tbsp. Minced Onion
- 1/4 Cup Flour
- 4 Cups Chicken Broth
- 2 Cups Cooked Wild Rice
- 1/2 Tsp. Salt
- 1 Cup Half & Half (I used whole Milk with a tablespoon of butter (oleo) added)

Minced Parsley or Chives

Optional: Use 3/4 cup diced Ham or Chicken

- 1/3 Cup grated Carrots
- 1/3 Cup slivered Almonds
- 1/3 Cup fine chopped Celery

Sauté onion in butter. Blend in flour. Gradually add broth, stirring constantly, until slightly thickened. Pour into crock pot. Add all other ingredients. Cook on low overnight. Garnish with parsley or chives. Double recipe fills 5 quart crock pot.

>For more volume in egg whites, let stand in room temperature before beating. Use a glass or metal bowl (not plastic) with a tapered bottom and wide top. (Egg whites expands six times when beaten, so make sure bowl is large enough).

>For quick baked potatoes, First cook 3 minutes in the microwave, then 20 minutes at 375° oven to crisp the skins. (remember to pierce the skins before micro waving!)


Dip fresh strawberries into Sour Cream or Yogurt and roll in strawberry-flavored gelatin granules for a tasty treat.

>When celery loses it's crispness, place in a pan of cold water along with a sliced raw potato. Let stand for an hour and the celery will again be crunchy.

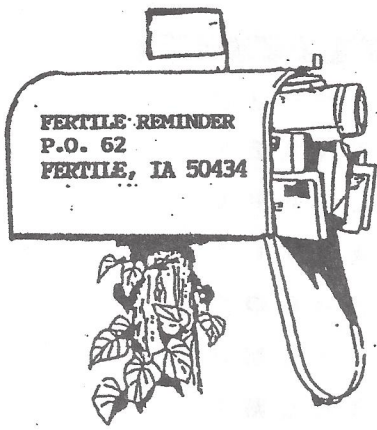
