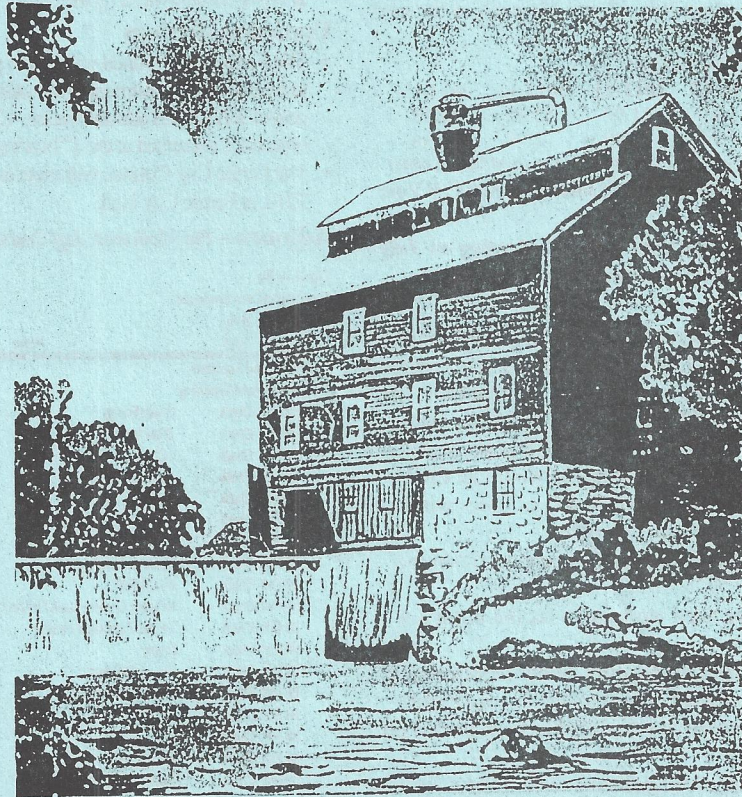

City Council Meeting Minutes

June 15, 2010 - 7:00 PM, City Hall

Call to Order & Roll Call

Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell; Council Members: Jeff Berg, Penny Miller, Tad Miller, Cindy Peters and Pat Renchin; and City Clerk Eddie May. Absent was Maintenance Manager Craig Koch.

Minutes Approval

- Tad motioned, Cindy 2nd to approve the May minutes. Motion Carried.

Waste Management Contract

- Darrel Hoekstra from Waste Management presented a new proposal to the Council which will raise rates 3% starting July 1st and 4% each of the next four years July 1, 2011 – June 30, 2015.

- The proposed rate increases are outlined below:

Garbage:	\$10.75	11.07	11.51	11.97	12.45	12.95

(The City currently charges \$11.50 for garbage and \$2.25 for recycling to cover billing costs)

- Jeff motioned, Tad 2nd to approve Waste Management's Increases. Roll Call Vote was unanimous, Motion Carried.
- The City will hold a public hearing at the next Council Meeting on July 20th to revise the utility billing ordinance to cover these increases.

Mayor's Report

- The resident at 210 West Main Street received a second notice of failure to abide by the City's Nuisance Ordinance. Last July Mr. Davis was ordered to clean-up his property and finish the siding on his house. At that time, Mr. Davis agreed to clean-up his property in 90 days, and to finish the siding within 6 months. Since progress has not been made on either point, Mr. Davis was given until July 1st to respond before charges would be filed.
- Kenny Strohman and Buck Russell put carpet on the 4 light poles within the ballfields as requested by the City's insurance company
- Kenny and June Strohman also donated two loads of gravel to fill-in the pot-holes along the ballpark road
- Alliant Energy and Hare Electric have been working to fix the burnt out lights around town
- The City of Fertile received \$2,000 from the Worth County Development Authority (non-profit arm of Diamond Joe Casino) to use for our Fertile Days Celebration on August 7 & 8 (tentative schedule has been posted on our website at www.fertileiowa.us)
- The town has experienced a new wave of vandalism over the last couple of months. The City will be stepping up law enforcement patrols and enforcing the curfew. The City will also be looking into upgrading and expanding the current surveillance system.
- Remember to keep your dogs on a leash or a chained up at all times when outside. If a dog bites a person who is walking down the street, the dog will be removed from City limits.
- Mayor Russell participated in a mock Tornado Disaster Drill in Manly sponsored by Worth County Emergency Management. Mayors, First Responders and Fire Departments from Worth County were invited to take part in a tornado disaster simulation. Mercy's Life Lite was also involved as they simulated various levels of wounds and medical issues.
- Two properties went up for Sherriff's auction this last month. There were no bids, as no one was in attendance for either sale. The two properties are now going back to the finance companies and their lawyers.
- There was a multi-jurisdictional drug bust last week. Arrests were made and both Federal and County charges are being pressed.
- There was a wedding the park last weekend. The rain held off just enough for the rehearsal and ceremony.
- There will be a large family reunion next Sunday.

City Clerk's Report

- Eddie presented the May financials.
- The following statistics report the % of budgeted revenue received year-to-date as well as the % of budgeted expenses spent year-to-date (92% of year).

(The Roads Fund is currently over budget due to the City's portion of the new road surfacing done in July, 2009.)

- The City currently has a \$6,691.75 Net Loss for the fiscal year.
- Pat motioned, Cindy 2nd to approve the May Expenses. Motion Carried.

Maintenance Report

- The DNR inspected the City's water system. For the first time in the City's history, there were no write ups!
- The water tower tank was cleaned on the inside. The City has written a grant to cover the costs of cleaning and painting the tower. We will hear if our grant has been accepted the last part of June or the first part of July.
- Brian Nettleton is putting a new sewer valve in this week.
- Craig and Dan Miller cut the belly blade off the snow plow as the hydraulics were no longer working.
- The City will be flushing the water mains in July.

Committee Reports

- Fertile Days:** The Fertile Days Committee has been working hard to organize several activities for our celebration. A tentative schedule will be posted on the City's website at www.fertileiowa.us by the end of the month.

Upcoming Meetings

- The Fertile City Council will hold a public hearing at 7:00PM, Tuesday, July 20th, 2010, to propose an amendment to the utility billing ordinances to allow the City to cover the cost of service and administration. (2nd and 3rd hearings can be waived if there are no objections presented at the 1st hearing – come and let your voice be heard)
- The Fertile City Council will meet at 7:15PM in regular session, Tuesday, July 20th, 2010, at Fertile City Hall.

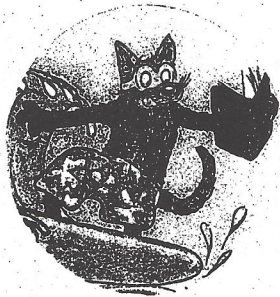

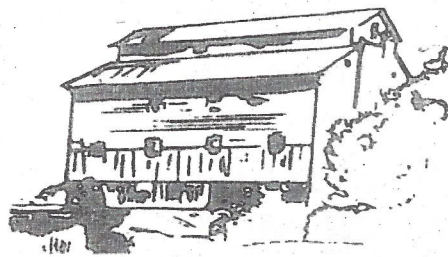

William Rhodes stared out with a saw mill. It was ready for operation by July of 1857, just eleven months after his arrival. It was the first saw mill in the county.

The first dam Rhodes built across the river was for his saw mill and was four feet high and made of logs.

Minor repairs were made to the dam in 1858 when high water cut around the south end. It was a very wet year and water made it's way around the dam again. After the second time, business was halted until it was repaired the following winter This forced Rhodes to cancel the order he had received to saw the lumber for the new court house in Mason City.

In February of 1859, Rhodes rounded up enough help to cut out the ice on the creek and extend the dam 50 feet. This dam held until 1929 when high water washed it out.

The original wooden dam was replaced with cement in 1932/33 after was was once again washed out.

Through the years the mill was used for grinding and mixing hundreds of tons of feed for chickens and livestock.

In later years farmers were not raising wheat and having it ground.

The main floor of the mill there were stones in the corner and they rumbled and vibrated and shook the whole building. The ceiling had many belts and pulleys driving the various elevator belts to take grain to the bins above.

The mill went through restoration in 1972 and living quarters were added on to the east end by the Halverson's. It was an antique store for several years, ran by Ann Hargraves. Then Ann Jones of Oklahoma bought the Mill and it became an antique store again. Also she had the rooms fixed up and people can rent the Mill to stay for a short vacation or rent to spend the summer as some gas line workers did.

There was a catwalk over the sluice that delivered the water to the water wheel. This was a torrent of water and fed to the monster wheel where before being flushed to the stream below the dam. The water wheel was inside a cistern type room under the southeast corner of the mill

In the pictures of the mill, the stonework on the southeast corner were the two walls of the cistern. At the bottom of this cistern, at about down stream level, was a horizontal slot where the water came churning out. This was a dark, churning hole so you did not want to get too close! After reading about the mill, this was probably a rather unique horizontal water wheel with the blades being somewhat akin to a windmill. Falling water struck the blades from the side and drove the wheel forward. Since mill stones must rotate in a horizontal plane, having a water wheel running in the horizontal plane eliminated the need for the 90 degree gear box. When this gear box was done in wood in the older eastern mills, it was the weakest link in the power train. It would be interesting to know if other mills in Iowa used this kind of water wheel or if Fertile was more unique than we might think!!

SUMMER CHICKEN SPAGHETTI SALAD

- 1 cup fat-free mayonnaise
- 2 Tbsp. Skim milk
- 1 tsp. Parsley flakes
- 1/8 tsp. Black Pepper
- 1/4 cup grated Kraft fat-free Parmesan cheese
- 2 cups cooked spaghetti, rinsed & drained AND cooled
- 1 cup diced tomatoes
- 3/4 cup chopped unpeeled cucumbers
- 1/4 cup finely chopped onion
- 1 1/2 cups diced cooked chicken breast

In a large bowl, combine mayonnaise, skim milk, parsley flakes, and black pepper. Stir in Parmesan cheese, onion and chicken. Mix well to combine. Cover and refrigerate for at least 30 minutes. Gently stir again just before serving.

(Hint: 1 1/2 cups broken uncooked spaghetti usually cooks to about 2 cups.)

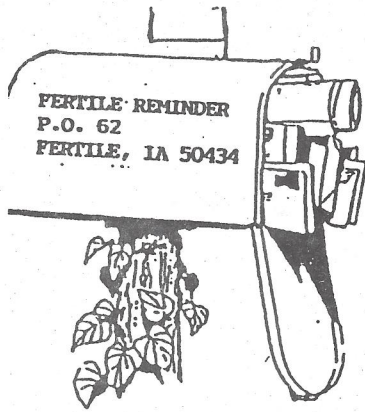
